Today, Sunday October 14th, the martyred Salvadorian Archbishop Óscar Romero, celebrated champion of the poor and oppressed, is being canonized by Pope Francis in Rome. We acknowledge and celebrate the event with arrangements of folk hymns from El Salvador played on organ and piano before and after today's service at St Paul'.

Also, in place of our usual 'Holy, holy' during the Eucharistic prayer, we will be singing an alternative well-known version of the Sanctus - *Santos, santos, santos* - from the Salvadorian folk mass that Óscar Romero co-authored.

Organ before the service: *Danos un corazón grande para amar...* (Give us a heart big enough for loving...)

Piano after the service: *Te alabarán oh señor, todos los reyes.... Porque Jesús atiende al humilde, mas mira de lejos al altivo.* (Psalm 138:4-6)

(All the kings will praise you, O Lord.... Because Jesus cares for the humble, but is distant from the proud.)
