Organ & piano

Music before and at the end of the service is taken from *Le Tombeau de Couperin* written by Maurice Ravel (1875-1937) between 1914 and 1917 in memory of friends killed in action in the First World War. Ravel's musical tributes are warm and reflective rather than cold and sombre - a portrayal of happier days.

Before the service: *Menuet*, in memory of Jean Dreyfus (whose mother cared for sick and wounded Ravel after he was demobilized)

End of the service: *Rigaudon* in memory of Ravel's childhood friends Pierre and Pascal Gaudin (brothers killed by the same shell in November 1914)
