From 10 am, a study morning of reflection and conversation with Dr Paula Gooder (on her recent book 'Phoebe') and Southwark's Lay Canon Theologian Professor Esther Mombo (on women's voices from Africa) will culminate in a Eucharist at 12.15 pm presided over by **Bishop Sarah Mullally DBE, the Bishop of London**. Thy Kingdom Come - Ascension to Pentecost (30 May to 9 June)

We would like to engage with this nationwide campaign promoted by our Archbishops to encourage more people to pray. This is the third year of running, and has been hugely appreciated in other parishes. St Paul's will be holding an Ascension Day service on Thursday 30 May as well as a special service to mark Pentecost on 9 June, both tying into theme of The Lord's Prayer. During this period we will be reflecting more upon this important Christian prayer with prayer stations set out in church as well as daily Compline.

For this purpose, there will be six prayer stations, one for each line of the prayer.
