From Bishop Christopher:

In recent weeks we have been hearing more about the terrible events that happened almost two years ago on 3rd June at London Bridge. The reports that we have been hearing as a result of the Inquest that is being held at the Old Bailey are harrowing and will be especially distressing for all those who were involved. Yet, as devastating as the events were, we are also hearing stories of great courage and self-sacrifice as people tried to help each other in the face of such terrifying event.

*...I have asked the Dean to write a prayer and would urge you all to remember all those affected by these terrible events in your prayers this weekend and next weekend as we approach the anniversary. There will be a service in the Cathedral on **3rd June** to remember those who died, were injured and affected by the atrocity. Please pray for those involved throughout the length of the Inquest.*

We raised £17,739 and the project cost £14,613, including costs of the Appeal and the Remembrance and Rededication Service. This gave a surplus of £3,126 which as agreed we have divided equally between the Royal British Legion and SSAFA. Each has been sent a cheque for £1,563, with a covering letter.
