Radios for Wandsworth Prison: We have been contacted by the chaplaincy team at Wandsworth Prison to ask if we can help provide 'wind-up' radios for loan to prisoners (of which there are about 1450 at any one time). Each radio costs £12.50. Please see the notice at the back of the church (or talk to Margaret Brown) for more details about how you can help support this very worthwhile initiative.

Vergers wanted: We are gathering together a team of church members willing to act as vergers to ensure that our events and services run smoothly. Duties will include setting up the church for weddings, funerals, concerts etc.; being on hand to assist attendees; supporting Revd Susan and the clerical team; and tidying up the church afterwards. Normally only one verger would be needed per event, so you will not be expected to be available for every church booking if you are on the team. We are looking for people who are physically fit (able to lift chairs and move pews), and who enjoy meeting and greeting our visitors. There will be a small remuneration for the time given. Collection: During this service we will take a collection to support the work of the Church. Many people instead choose to contribute by direct debit. This augments your contribution by 25% with no additional cost to you. Higher rate taxpayers can also claim back the difference between the rate they pay and the basic rate on their donation.
