Friends of Urambo and Mwanhala (FUM) 5th Annual Sponsored Walks:

This summer I am once again organising and participating in two 15-mile sponsored walks: on 20th July on Dartmoor and 7th Sept on the South Downs Way. FUM is a small charity working in the Tabora region of Tanzania. Money raised will go towards providing a clean reliable water supply and staff housing for the newly constructed Primary Care Clinic in Ibambo, an isolated village in the Tabora Region. Radios for Wandsworth Prison: We have been contacted by the chaplaincy team at Wandsworth Prison to ask if we can help provide 'wind-up' radios for loan to prisoners (of which there are about 1450 at any one time). Each radio costs £12.50. Please see the notice at the back of the church (or talk to Margaret Brown) for more details about how you can help support this very worthwhile initiative.

Creationtide, or The Season of Creation, is a season in the Church calendar in which Christians focus our attention on God's creation and humanity's responsibility as good stewards. Creationtide is a concept introduced by the late Ecumenical Patriarch, Demetrios I, 1989. Since then, 1st September (chosen because it is first day of the Orthodox ecclesiastical year) has been adopted as the start of the season. Creationtide runs through St Francis day on 4th October and will end with our Harvest Festival. The season's start and end dates reflect that it is a shared idea between Western and Eastern Christianity. While its adoption was in part driven by the complex environmental crises the human race faces, Creationtide draws on much deeper roots in Scripture and in older Christian traditions of the relationship between God, humanity and the created order.

At St Paul's, we will be engaging with Creationtide in several ways including special liturgy, music, homilies and prayer stations. Our own Bishop Richard will be preaching for us on 15th September. I would be grateful for your support in creating prayer stations: one for each of the 'seven days of creation'. These will need to be in place by the beginning of September.
