Creationtide, or The Season of Creation, is a season in the Church calendar in which Christians around the world focus our attention on God's creation and humanity's responsibility as good stewards. The season runs from 1st September to 6th October when we will celebrate our Harvest Festival. While its adoption was in part driven by the complex environmental crises the human race faces, Creationtide draws on much deeper roots in Scripture and in older Christian traditions of the relationship between God, humanity and the created order.

At St Paul's, we will be engaging with Creationtide in several ways including special liturgy, music, homilies and prayer stations. Our own Bishop Richard will be preaching for us on 15th September. I would be grateful for your support in creating prayer stations: one for each of the 'seven days of creation' found in Genesis. These will need to be in place by the beginning of September. Major gas works in Augustus Road and Inner Park Road have now resumed and will last for approximately 5 months. The project will progress along Augustus Road and Inner Park Road in four phases, the first phase being the section between the junctions of Victoria Drive and Inner Park Road in front of church. **This phase is scheduled to take a further week, during which the eastbound lane between these junctions will be closed.** A signed diversion will be in place via Inner Park Road - Windlesham Grove -Victoria Drive. **On-street parking within the work area and directly in front of church will not be possible.** As the works move into Inner Park Road, there will be further phased parking restrictions, lane suspensions and traffic closures affecting sections between Tibbets Close and Kingsmere Road. We ask our congregation to be aware of the works and the resulting disruption, and to allow extra time for their journeys to and from church.

Collection: During this service we will take a collection to support the work of the Church. Many people instead choose to contribute by direct debit.
