Creationtide, or The Season of Creation, is a season in the Church calendar in which Christians around the world focus our attention on God's creation and humanity's responsibility as good stewards. At St Paul's, are engaging with Creationtide in several ways including special liturgy, music, homilies and prayer stations. Our own Bishop Richard will be preaching for us on 15th September. The season runs from 1st September to 6th October when we will celebrate our Harvest Festival. We hope you will make time to enjoy all that will be offered during this season.

Confirmation on 10th November. There will be a confirmation service at St Margaret's Putney in the evening of 10th November, to which St Paul's candidates are invited. If you are interested in taking part, there will be preparation sessions in the weeks leading up to confirmation at suitably agreed times. There is no upper age limit!
