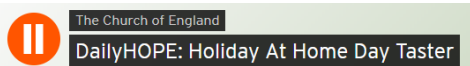

Music between readings is from the ballet *The Pharaoh's Daughter* by **Cesare Pugni** (1802-1870), based on a novel about an explorer who falls asleep in Pharaoh's tomb dreaming of ancient Egypt at the time of Moses. Tally accompanies the music on a *sistrum*, a sacred instrument in ancient Egypt that continues to be used in the Christian Coptic Church. The jingling sound was thought to match the sound of the wind in the bulrushes - or rustling leaves of a 'burning bush' - that was heard as the breath or spirit of God.
