Church Events

Remember George Cobbett, killed 23rd August 1918: Private George Cobbett is recorded on our War Memorial (and on St Barnabas war memorial). He was killed in action aged 18. He joined St Paul's choir in 1909. George's brother, Sidney, was recruited to St Paul's choir by Choirmaster Mr Dean, who was a schoolmaster at West Hill School, where Sidney was a pupil. Sidney sang in St Paul's choir from 1904 to 1910, when his voice broke. Thereafter he kept in touch by being a sort of general factotum to Mr Dean (organ blowing on occasions) until he enlisted in 1914 at the outbreak of war. On his return in 1919 he became a sidesman until his marriage, at St Paul's, in 1924, after which he moved to Bromley. He mentions that at his departure he received a 'very appreciative letter' from the Church Council. Sidnet Cobbett sent his recollections of his time at St Paul's to Arthur Manning after the publication of Manning's history of St Paul's, published in 1956.
